

Receptive Language

Children's Speech and Language Therapy Acute and Community AHPs

Introduction

This leaflet is produced for parents who may have concerns about their child's receptive language development. We hope you find this information useful.

Receptive language

Receptive language refers to our ability to understand spoken words and sentences. When we talk to children we use questions, instructions and description. The words and sentences that the child needs to understand may be simple for example, 'Shut the door' or complex for example, 'After you put your book in your bag and put your coat next to the window, can you shut the door?'

Our understanding of words and sentences used around us relies on our receptive language skills.

Some children experience difficulties understanding spoken words and sentences.

A child may have difficulty with one or more of the following:

- Learning new words
- Processing and holding information
- Struggling to answer questions
- Struggling to follow spoken instructions
- Expressing themselves

Other signs that a child is having difficulty include:

- Frequently asking for clarification
- Asking an adult or friend for help to answer guestions
- Asking an adult or friend for help with following instructions

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Strategies to develop receptive language skills

- Make sure the child is paying full attention to you before talking to them
- Keep information as short and simple as possible
 - Break information into smaller chunks
 - Give instructions one at a time
 - Give instructions in the order in which they are to be carried out
- Use visual support when possible such as gestures and pictures
- Give your child time to think about what you have said
 - Repeat instructions
 - Rephrase instructions
