Bandage Contact Lenses

Ophthalmology

This leaflet is intended for patients who need to wear a bandage contact lens for a period of time.

What is bandage contact lens?

A bandage contact lens is a soft lens which does not have any focusing power. It is not intended to improve your vision, but designed to protect diseased cornea from the mechanical rubbing of the blinking eyelids, therefore allowing it to heal. The bandage lens often makes the eye feel more comfortable.

Will I feel the lens?

You may be aware of the lens when it is placed on the front of the eye but after few minutes the eye should become more comfortable.

How will the bandage lens be inserted?

The bandage contact lens will be inserted by the doctor or the nurse at the hospital, it will stay in your eye until your next hospital appointment. Most people need the bandage contact lens for short periods. Occasionally you might need to wear bandage lens on a long term basis. Your doctor will discuss with you all the benefits of wearing a lens for longer periods.

What are the complications and side effects?

Please contact us immediately if you experience any of the following:

- Your vision suddenly goes hazy or blurred
- Your eye becomes red and painful
- Stickiness
- Your eye becomes watery or has discharge
- You are unable to see clearly

What should I expect after the procedure?

After sleeping with the lens in your eye, your eye may feel dry first thing in the morning. You will be given some lubrication eye drops to use at night before going to bed and first thing in the morning.

Occasionally you may notice that the lens becomes dislodged or even falls out. If this occurs please contact the team using the numbers below.

- Please decontaminate your hands frequently for 20 seconds using soap and water or alcohol gel if available
- If you have symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, cough or other respiratory symptoms, a temperature or any loss of taste or smell please do not visit the hospital or any other care facility and seek advice from 111

When do I come back for follow up?

You may be advised before you go home when your follow up appointment will be. However, if you are advised that your appointment will be sent to you in the post and you do not receive one within the expected time, please contact the team using the numbers below.
