Introduction

This leaflet will explain how to care for your leg whilst wearing a knee brace, how to maintain your knee brace, and who to contact if you have any problems.

Care of your leg

You should do the following on a daily basis

- 1. Inspect all aspects of your leg which come into contact with the knee brace checking for red marks, abrasions, bruising, or wounds. Use a mirror or ask someone for help if necessary.
- 2. If you are experiencing discomfort or the skin is marked, red, or broken, please contact the orthotics department immediately for advice.

Wearing regime

This will be individual to each patient. Please follow the instructions written by the orthotist in the table on page 2.

Review appointments and maintenance of your knee brace

Please check your knee brace for wear and tear daily, make sure there are no loose parts on your knee brace before putting it on. Make sure (if appropriate) that the knee joint fully locks before standing up in your brace.

There are many different styles of knee braces; you will be given the most appropriate brace for your condition.

The orthotics department has a patient initiated follow-up policy, which means you can contact us when you feel you need a review appointment. Your orthotist will advise you how often you should have your knee brace reviewed.

If you have any concerns regarding your knee brace please contact the orthotics department directly to seek advice or request a review appointment.
