

Electrolysis

Ophthalmology



This leaflet is for patients who have ingrowing eyelashes on the eyelid and have been told they need a minor procedure to remove them. The aim of the leaflet is to inform you what to expect during and after your procedure.

What is Electrolysis?

Electrolysis is the removal of eyelashes using a fine electric current to destroy the eyelash follicle at the root. This procedure is performed in the outpatient department under local anaesthetic.

Why do I need Electrolysis / What happens during the procedure?

You need electrolysis to remove in growing eyelashes. Ingrowing eyelashes (trichiasis) turn inwards and rub against the front of the eye causing irritation. It may be due to conditions of the lid or the lining of the lid (conjunctiva) e.g. blepharitis - inflammation of the edge of the lids. It can also be caused by injuries to the lid such as burns or by previous surgery.

Anaesthetic

We use local anaesthetic eye drops and an injection into the affected eyelid to numb the area. With a local anaesthetic you will be awake during the procedure.

The prevention of infection is a major priority in all healthcare and everyone has a part to play.

- Please decontaminate your hands frequently for 20 seconds using soap and water or alcohol gel if available
- If you have symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, cough or other respiratory symptoms, a temperature or any loss of taste or smell please do not visit the hospital or any other care facility and seek advice from 111
- Keep the environment clean and tidy

Consent

The choice about which treatment is best for you will be made together with your doctor. This will be based on the risks and benefits of the treatment and your individual circumstances. The doctor will have explained the different treatment options to you and what will happen if you decide not to have any treatment at all.

Before you have the procedure you will be asked to sign a consent form. It is important that you understand the information given to you before you decide to have surgery. Consent form information is available in large print on request.

Do I need to do anything prior to the procedure?

No preparation is required prior to the procedure.

How long will this procedure take?

The time taken can vary and will depend on how many eyelashes need removal.

What to expect after your procedure

You may have your eye padded for up to 4 hours. After a minor operation your eye / eyelid may feel sore. If this is so, you may take your usual brand of painkiller. Take this as directed and do not exceed the recommended dose.

You may wash the area as normal from the following day. If the Doctor has prescribed a cream for your eyelid, please use it as directed. This is an antibiotic and will help the wound heal quickly. The treatment should be used as prescribed.

Will the eyelashes grow again?

It is possible that this treatment may need to be repeated if these lashes grow again. The doctor will advise you about your follow-up appointment.

What are the risks / side effects?

- There may be bruising around the eye
- There is a small risk of infection of the lid or eye
- You may have an allergic reaction to the local anaesthetic injection or the antibiotic ointment drops.

What are the benefits?

- Relief of symptoms
- Reduction of infection in the eye.
