


Cyst Removal

Ophthalmology



This leaflet is intended for patients who have a cyst on their eye that requires removal.

What should I do following removal of the cyst?

- 1. Keep the pad on for the next 4 6 hours. Then you can take it off and throw it away. Your eye does not need to be covered at all after this
- 2. Apply the ointment that the Doctor has prescribed for you by gently pulling down the lower lid of your affected eye and squeezing a little of the ointment into the space behind the eyelid and eyeball. The Doctor will advise how often this is required.

What should I expect following the procedure?

- 1. Your eyelid may feel a little sore during the rest of the day. If so, take your usual brand of pain killer as directed on the packet
- 2. Any bruising should disperse naturally over the next week or so.

The prevention of infection is a major priority in all healthcare and everyone has a part to play.

- Please decontaminate your hands frequently for 20 seconds using soap and water or alcohol gel if available
- If you have symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, cough or other respiratory symptoms, a temperature or any loss of taste or smell please do not visit the hospital or any other care facility and seek advice from 111
- Keep the environment clean and tidy
- Let's work together to keep infections out of our hospitals and care homes.

What precautions should I take following the procedure?

1. Do not go swimming for the next couple of weeks.

In the unlikely event of bleeding from your eyelid apply direct pressure to the closed eye, using a clean tissue. If the bleeding does not stop please contact the hospital.
